
Facilities

During the holidays C Block was completely refurbished and had asbestos removal which was a huge job. There were a lot of workmen who around the clock addressed all of the room changes. The teachers Ms Cullen, Mrs Adams, Mrs Delaney, Mrs Martin and Ms McCaughey were given access to their rooms on Thursday afternoon on the Pupil Free Days and worked tirelessly over the weekend to have the classrooms ready for the first day of school. In saying that, we are evaluating stairwell areas that need repainting. The Senior Girl's toilets were also refurbished and they are looking at painting the outside of C Block during the year.

The staff completed their first module of Berry Street, key parts of the PD involved every class starting the day with a Welcome Circle.

The **Berry Street Welcome Circle** is a routine that occurs at the start of the day at Berry Street schools. It serves as a **nurturing practice** to support engagement in learning and well-being. During this circle, students gather to review key values and expectations, celebrate announcements and successes, and establish a common rhythm for the learning day. This practice helps ground students, co-regulate, and fosters a sense of belonging and connection within the school community.

Every class will be commencing the day with the circle, even if they are at a specialist lesson. The importance of routines and ready to learn was explored and brain breaks. Once we implement the program we would like to extend to a parent information workshop on the program.



Hot Weather and Storms

Each day we will judge the direction of the weather, on extremely hot days air con play will be offered or we will have Plan C where the students have play in the classrooms. If a storm occurs during school time the students stay inside until it passes. The old Murphy's Law with storms happening at 3pm is a regular occurrence. If it does occur the students stay in their classrooms and will be released when the storm passes. An SMS will be sent to all parents to inform them of what is happening. Staff will not be collecting children if parents present to the office requesting their child/ren during the storm, everyone will have to wait until the storm finishes for safety reasons.

Bus Students

We have many students catching buses and expect high behaviour. Admin and aides walk the students onto the buses each day and discuss behaviour expectations. We can't monitor what occurs on the bus and some children do at times misbehave, we do follow through at school with consequences and request parents to call the bus company to report an incident as the children are under their care when in travel. A Bus Code of Conduct has been provided to the students this week.
